Dear Friend,

We are writing to invite you to become a member of the newly founded **Society for the Preservation of Rare Books**. The first and foremost objective of the SPRB is to help small libraries and institutions with emergency funding for conservation and targeted digitisation projects.

Recent events have shown how easily our cultural heritage can be lost forever. But as many books are lost to conflicts and natural disasters, an equal number is lost to neglect: this is where the SPRB can make a difference.

The SPRB will reach those libraries and institutions that usually fall out of the scope of large grants, and invest 50-60% of its budget sharing it between emergency conservation and digitisation projects targeting relevant texts and editions at risk of being lost forever. For instance, by supporting the conservation of the few manuscripts and rare books in the National Library of Corfu, where the entire library is being devoured by silverfish, or the digitisation of the only incunable ever printed in the Sardinian language, which survives in only two copies in the world.

Beyond this primary concern, the SPRB also aims at:

- i) providing partial funding towards the inclusion of small libraries (public and private) in international cataloguing projects: the more we know about small collections, the better we can protect them. It is always worth remembering that, if a book is not catalogued, *it does not exist* (30-40% of budget);
- ii) fostering a new generation of book collectors. Bibliophilia is not declining, but young collectors and book-lovers are increasingly scattered and isolated: the SPRB will encourage the formation and support the activities of student bibliophile associations (10% of budget);
- iii) raising funds to provide an endowment, whose revenue will enable the SPRB to provide immediate financial support when needed in an emergency.

### **Advisory Committee**

The SPRB will select projects with the aid of an advisory committee of specialists, and, on an annual basis, it will report to its members, updating them on all the current projects and on all completed activities.

Current members include Nicolas Barker (London), Scott Clemons (Grolier), Andrea De Pasquale (Roma), Cristina Dondi (Oxford), Clare Hills-Nova (Oxford), Leonora Navari (Athens), Paul Needham (Princeton), Adalbert Roth (Vatican), Edwin Schroeder (Yale), William Stoneman (Harvard), Agamemnon Tselikas (Athens) and Henry Woudhuysen (Oxford).

### Benefits

As a member of the SPRB, you will join a lively and energetic network of benefactors of the written cultural heritage. Among other benefits, the SPRB will provide, free on request, the following services:

- i) should you require an expert to consult on your private collection, the SPRB can connect you to the top scholars in the field;
- ii) the SPRB can act as a filter for anyone, scholar or otherwise, wishing to access a private collection, such as your own, vetting the applicants, advising on applications for access and enabling secure arrangements for it;
- iii) connection between members visiting other cities and countries. The SPRB will endeavour to encourage contact and communication between its members, towards a larger and more integrated community of book-lovers and library supporters.

We very much hope you will accept our invitation and join the Society for the Preservation of Rare Books.
